Biz in the Pris Comic Book- Version 1 'Craving the Blues' was co-produced by young men of Hydebank Wood College - William, Michael A, Michael B. and another, who devised the story and designed the characters, in conjunction with Prison Healthcare (the South Eastern Health & Social Care Trust) and the Prison Arts Foundation. The idea for the production of a comic came from MINDLOCK, another Trust comic book publication.










I'm Mentor Man and I'm here to teach ye Buck Eejits about the dangers of taking all sorts.















But it wasn't long before *Diaze-Man* went f**kin nuts and started a riot! His weapon of choice was snooker balls.




The Zombie King was not for having it and let his army of The Sleeping Dead loose. It was pure hectic.


But withdrawal also affects your mental health and can leave your head wrecked.

Go on then, press play...




Mentor Man resumes the story




Diaze-Man no longer felt invincible he felt defeated, deflated and depressed.




When you cannot control your stinkin' thinkin' find someone to talk to, ring your family or talk to staff. When your head's away don't be an eejit just say!



Mentor Man resumes the story




Diaze-Man started taking time for himself, filling up his day with new things - most importantly, he started to talk to people and not bottle everything up.





I need to STOP and THINK.


It's not about hating drugs, going off them and never thinking about them ever again.

You can use your medications just don't abuse them!



Mentor Man remembers that his decisions are his choice and no one else's and he wants to live a long and healthy life.











DRUG GLOSSARY



Diaze-Man is based on the drug diazepam. In prison, diazepam is often known as Blues or Mellow Yellows.



The **Zolpidem Zombie King** is based on zolpidem, a sleeping tablet used to treat insomnia.



Budzilla is based on pregabalin, a pain/ anxiety medication. Pregabalin is also known as lyrica and in Prison is known as Buds.




CO-PRODUCTION IN ACTION

- Really worthwhile, good craic, good laugh, creative and fun










- The young men have gained skills that are transferable to other opportunities in life
