The Ulster Cancer Foundation (UCF) is encouraging smokers to think about their wealth as well as their health. Judith West, Cancer Prevention Officer said, "As the impact of the credit crunch starts to bite, many families are feeling the pinch. And for smokers it's particularly tough. Those with a 20-a-day smoking habit spend a staggering £2,000 a year on cigarettes – enough to buy a second-hand car! "Our stop smoking clinics are very informal and offer individual and group support. We talk about smoking habits, tips for giving up and how to cope with cravings. We have provided almost 30 clinics in the last year and helped over 50% of those attending to stop smoking within four weeks." Ideas for Dads and Kids

Mother's Day is Sunday 22nd March this year, so why not get your apron on and make a nice treat ...

Chocolate-coated Strawberries

Ingredients and materials:

- □ 1 punnet of washed strawberries with stalks if possible
- 200g / 7oz block of milk chocolate broken into pieces
- Baking sheet / tray
- □ Greaseproof paper
- □ Saucepan
- □ Large heatproof bowl

Method:

- 1. Line a baking sheet or tray with greaseproof paper.
- 2. Dad only zone! ... Heat some water to boiling point in a saucepan.
- 3. **Dad only zone!** ... Place the chocolate into a large heatproof bowl and place it over the pan of boiling water. Make sure that the base of the bowl does not come into contact with the water. Stir the chocolate until it is melted and remove the bowl from the pan.
- 4. Hold the Strawberries by the stalks, and dip them into the melted chocolate. Place them on the greaseproof paper and leave to set in a cool place for 2 hours.
